Read John 1:1-18


- 2. What *facts* do we learn about the Word from verses 1-5 and 10-18?

8. Contrast how human assessment would view this situation (vv. 1-3) with how God viewed it (v. 4).

9. What is the process God has laid out for reaching people with His message of salvation?

What steps are involved, according to this passage?

What is the "bottom line" in verses 14-15?

Read Acts 12:21-24; 13:48-49; 14:21; 16:30-34

- 11. How does seeing the power of the Holy Spirit in the resource of God's Word and in the lives of the non-Apostles in the early church encourage <u>you</u> to "speak the Word boldly"?

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
