# Statement of Faith

We believe that the Holy Bible is the Word of God and that it has been kept free of error through His Divine intervention throughout the ages. (Sola Scriptura)

We believe in the Trinity - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

We believe the Scripture teaches that Jesus the Christ, who is both God and man, was born of a virgin - lived a life which was completely without sin - suffered and died on a cross - returned to life three days later - walked, talked and ate with many during the next 40 days - finally, He ascended to heaven where He sits at God's right hand awaiting the resurrection of us all.

We believe that Jesus the Christ is the Messiah (promised by God throughout the Old Testament period) and therefore is the sole way for humankind to achieve eternal life in heaven. (Sola Fide)

We believe that the only way that this eternal salvation can be attained by us is as a free gift from God - there is nothing that we can do or say which will cause us to be saved from the penalty of our sins - only by God's grace. (Sola Gratia)

We believe that the Book of Concord assists us in properly interpreting Scripture because it is a normative set of creeds that define Christianity from a Lutheran perspective.

### **WORSHIP**

A congregation that is a community of believers valuing Christ-centered weekly worship that engages individuals of all generations to be empowered to "Share His Love".

### GOALS BY 2009

- We will increase our worshiping community to at least 1500.
- Each style of worship will have a Worship Team and Leader to plan and implement the services.
- Double the participation of people in the prayer ministry.
- Have staffing in worship for creative arts.
- Increase the position of Minister of Music and Minister of Technology.
- Signing for deaf
- Welcoming people better trained greeters
- Add services
- Sign changed
- Creative arts Dance Drama Decorations

### **EDUCATION**

A congregation that is involved in the study of God's Word personally and corporately.

### GOALS BY 2009

- Hold at least one personal and spiritual growth campaign.
- A Christian Day School of 2 classrooms per grade supported by tuition and congregational support not to exceed 20% of the cost of the Day School. Continued enrollment and recruitment to keep up the number enrolled.
- Every staff member and leader is actively involved in Bible study.
- Begin a program for 2 year olds called, "Tiny Treasures
- Children's education ministry that includes at least 500 of Immanuel's children (ages 0 6th grade) and Youth Education Ministry that includes at least 350 of Immanuel's youth (7<sup>th</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> grade).
- Adult Bible study classes attendance for the week totaling at least 450.
- Establish a full-day Kindergarten.
- Offer more ministry opportunities involving 7-12<sup>th</sup> graders.

### **EVANGELISM**

A congregation that seeks God's heart of compassion, and a burning desire to share His love with those who do not know Him in our community, nation, and globally.

### GOALS BY 2009

- To hold a mission emphasis weekend at least once a year.
- At least 300 individuals have been trained in witnessing through a specific evangelism course.
- Adult confirmands and baptisms totaling at least 60 per year.
- Continue youth mission trips at least once per year and adult team mission trips 4 times per year.
- Offer Evangelism Course at least two times a year.
- 75% of the guests who attend six times or more per year become members.

### **FELLOWSHIP**

A congregation that experiences the joy of gathering together to develop meaningful relationships that uplift one another as a Christian community.

### GOALS BY 2009

- Congregational Fellowship Event in 2008 (5 years after 150<sup>th</sup> 5 Years of Grace)
- Increase the number of groups (with the key components of Fellowship, Service, Task, or Bible Study) by 50.
- Have Leadership Training (Boards and Staff) at least once a year.
- Small Group Leader training at least once a year.

### **SERVICE**

A congregation that is involved in a meaningful ministry of service to God, others and self.

### GOALS BY 2009

- 80% of new members will be actively involved in one ministry and in worship 75% of the time after one year.
- Develop our volunteer information in a format that is easily accessible for our leadership.

- Develop a staff position of a Small Group Minister.

# How We Grow In Our New Life As Disciples

Now that we understand what our new life in Christ is, we will learn how to grow strong and effective in it.

A. Just as a newborn child has received complete life as a free gift, yet must receive nourishment and exercise to continue to live, so we who are "born again" must nourish and exercise our new life in Christ. On the one hand, prayer is clearly a "powerful and effective" action as James 5:16 states. "Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective." On the other hand, it is an action in which sinful and weak humans sometimes find difficulty understanding and applying. Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 13:12, "that although we can only see and understand partly now, in heaven we will see and understand clearly."

### How to Read the Bible

"Like newborn babies long for the pure spiritual milk, than by it you may grow up in your salvation," - 1 Peter 2:2

### The following are suggestions to help you as you read the Bible:

Select a book of the Bible as a unit of God's Word to be studied over a period of time.

Read the passage through several times, noting the questions and observations as you read. You are reading God's Word so ask Him for understanding.

Understand the whole picture of the book.

Who is the author?

What are the circumstances?

What are the major divisions of thought?

To assist you in your reading, use a Bible concordance or commentary, an atlas, a dictionary or handbook.

When reading a given passage, ask yourself these questions:

What is the major idea?

What blessings does this passage remind me of for which I should thank God?

What sin does this remind me of, for which I should ask God's forgiveness?

What duties toward God and others does this remind me of, for the performance of which I must ask God's help?

What does this passage mean to me for my daily living? What am I going to do about it?







# Church Etiquette

When we come to the house of the Lord, there are certain things that we need to keep in mind. **First** - We come out of thankfulness to God. **Second** - He deserves our respect as a loving Father and a righteous judge. Therefore, we come into His presence with a proper attitude.

### WORSHIP IS:

Reverence to God: respect, honor and devotion.

### AN ATTITUDE OF WORSHIP:

Our Lord speaks and we listen. His Word and Spirit gives what it says. Faith that is born from what is heard and acknowledges the gifts received with eager thankfulness and praise. Music is drawn into this thankfulness and praise, enlarging and elevating the adoration of our gracious God.

Saying back to Him what He has said to us, we repeat what is most true and sure. Most true and sure is His name, which He put upon us with the water and Word of our baptism. We are His. This we acknowledge at the beginning of worship. We are freed, forgiven, and acclaim Him as our great and gracious God.

### **BEFORE WORSHIP:**

Be on time: One of the greatest social errors is to arrive late for a formal dinner. The church is a meeting place. We go there to meet God and our brothers and sisters in Christ. We are not to be less respectable to God than we would be to an earthly host. Arriving late disturbs the worshipers who arrive on time and it deprives the latecomer of the full benefit of the worship service. Try to arrive at least five to ten minutes before the start of the service.

Child Needs: For your convenience, we have established a quality nursery, which is available to you during all worship services except for the Sunday 7:45 am service. Children aged three and under will enjoy free play, snacks and story time while parents take part in the worship service. If your children will be worshipping with you, please take them to the drinking fountain and restroom <a href="mailto:before">before</a> the service begins so that they won't have to disturb others during the service. We have children's bulletins available to assist you with your children during worship. Please encourage your child to draw on the children's bulletins and not on the nametags, We Care Cards, Credit Card Forms or Envelopes.

**Seating:** Please take a seat nearest to the center of the pew row. This way, other people may come in and sit down without being forced to crowd their way through or stumble over your feet or knees. Finally, bow your head and speak a silent prayer. Ask God to bless the Pastor's message, and ask Him to help you listen to His Word.

### Quiet Meditation:

Spend the remaining moments before the service in quiet meditation. Look up the Scriptures for the day and read them. Read the hymns to be sung during the service. Take note of the bulletin information displayed on the screens.

### **DURING WORSHIP:**

Sit As A Family Unit: Encourage the children to participate in the service by using the Bible, worship bulletin, and by standing and sitting at the appropriate times.

Take An Active Role: Join enthusiastically in the speaking and singing during worship. This is a great witness to your children.

**Listen To The Message:** Listen to hear what God wants to say to you. Discover what He wants you to do. The outline of the service is printed in the Worship folder.

*Help Our Guests:* Assist them if necessary on understanding how to use the worship folder. Greet them before or after the service to make them feel like part of our family. Introduce yourself to the guests.

# Limited Movement During Worship:

- Exiting and entering causes distractions to other worshippers.
- There should be <u>no movement during the message</u>. The message is structured to apply God's Word to our lives; unnecessary movement distracts and breaks the thought process of the pastor and people. Other worshipers may miss a key thought that could have provided the help they needed.
- If is it necessary to leave or enter the worship area. Movement should be confined to when the congregation is singing. Do not enter or leave while someone is speaking.
- If there is a small child (3 years and under) that is known to have difficulty remaining restful for one hour, he/she may be taken to the nursery before the service starts. Another opportune time to take your child to the nursery is immediately following the Children's message.
- If a child occasionally needs to be taken out of the worship service for a few minutes, reenter during the time when the congregation is singing.
- Encourage children to refrain from using the bathroom or drinking fountain as an excuse for leaving worship.

### AT THE CONCLUSION OF WORSHIP:

- Nothing but an extreme emergency should necessitate an exit from the worship service before the last hymn is concluded.
- Do not put on your jackets/coats, hats or other outerwear during the last hymn and "run" for the door.
- Greet your fellow worshipers. Help to give the church an atmosphere of warmth and friendliness. Make a special effort to speak with the people around you, as one of them may be a guest. Make them feel welcome and invite them to worship with us again.

# WAYS TO MAKE YOUR VISIT TO WORSHIP MORE MEANINGFUL:

- Attend with a worshipful attitude.
- Remember God ordained the church.
- Thank God for the freedom to worship.

- Remember God is present during worship.
- + Look for ways the message can be relevant in your life.
- Apply the message to your own life, not your neighbors.
- Be involved in Bible class and other rewarding activities.
- Involve your children in Little Gems or Living Stones.
- Ask the Lord what you can do in your church.

### INVOLVING YOUR CHILDREN IN WORSHIP:

At what age can you expect a child to sit quietly in church? The ability to sit quietly in worship is a developed by example of self-control. He/she will learn it in small increments during the first few years of his/her life. Perhaps by four years of age he/she should be able to control his/her activity and sit in church without making any loud disturbance, by dropping things, waving their arms around, etc. But even at that age, punishment for noise is inappropriate except in instances of deliberate and willful defiance.

### TIPS FOR PARENTS:

### Before Worship

- + Sit near the front where your child can easily see what is happening.
- In the order of worship help your child identify, find and make locations of hymns and Scripture readings.
- + Let your child underline all the words in the bulletin he/she can read.
- Briefly explain the meaning of any difficult words or phrases in at least the first hymn you will sing.
- Share your own feelings about the hymns to be sung: "This is one of my favorites," "I really like to sing this one because it helps me to tell God I really love Him," "This is one I've never learned," etc.

# During Worship

- Let your child help hold the bulletin, or the Bible. Run your finger beneath the words being sung to help your child follow along.
- Touch your child, not just when he/she wiggles, to build a sense of warmth in being together.
- + Have your child draw a picture of something the pastor talks about in his message.
- Point out important items on the screens such as pictures that enhance the message that may interest your child.
- Let your children, if they are of appropriate age, help you during worship if you are an usher, etc.
- During the greeting be sure to introduce your child to those around you.
- + Let your child take part in passing the offering plate or filling out the "We Care Card."

# After Worship

- Express your appreciation at being in worship with the child.
- Dommend your child for specific times when he/she was participating well, i.e. "You really did a good job singing that first hymn."

- Talk about what went on in the service. Avoid making this sound like an exam, but ask one or two questions to let the child know that you expect him/her to be listening. A few good questions to ask are:
  - -What is one thing you remember from the service?
  - -Which hymn/song did you like the best?
  - -What was the Pastor trying to teach us about?
- Share your own answers to those questions, or let your child ask you any questions he/she desires.
- Explain one or two things that happened in the service that you think your child was interested in or could have been confused by.

### Additional Guidelines

- Teach children to walk (not to run) in the church. When they come up to the front for the Children's message, teach your child that the reason they are going up to the front is to hear a special message for them. Inform them that if there is not enough room to sit on the steps, it is OK to sit on the floor.
- If you bring items to help occupy your child do bring religious items and items that <u>do not</u> make noise.
- Teach children to keep feet off the back of the pew in front of them. This avoids scratching the finish or wearing the upholstery.
- Teach children proper care of the Bible and Hymnals. Bending them backwards breaks the spine of the book. These books are not to be written in or to have pages torn out of them.
- Teach children that the "We Care Cards", nametags, giving forms and "Love" envelopes are not to be used by them. These items are very costly to have printed and are for adult use only.
- Remember that the building is part of the church.

# Church Etiquette

"There before me was a door standing open in heaven.....and there before me was a throne in heaven with someone sitting on it. From the throne came flashes of lightening, rumblings, and peals of thunder......in the center around the throne, were four living creatures. Who day and night never stopped saying, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God Almighty, who was, and is, and is to come." Whenever the living creatures give glory, honor, and thanks to Him who sits on the throne, and who lives forever and ever, the twenty-four elders fall down before Him who sits on the throne, and worship Him who lives forever and ever. They lay their crowns before the throne and say: "You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being.
